## Don't Be a Victim

Be cautious when providing personal information such as your Social Security number and account or credit card information in person, on the telephone or over the internet.

1. Protect your Social Security number and the numbers of family members by not carrying it in your wallet.
2. Report lost or stolen checks, credit or debit cards immediately.
3. Store cancelled checks, new checks and account statements in a safe place.
4. Notify authorities of suspicious phone inquiries such as those asking for account information to "verify a statement" or "award a prize".
5. Review your credit report at least once every year. Make sure all information is up-to-date and accurate.
6. Memorize your PIN and refrain from writing it, your Social Security number or credit card number on a check.
7. Tear up or shred any pre-approved credit offers to which you do not respond. Thieves can use these offers to assume your identity.
8. Keep mail secure. Don't mail bills or sensitive information from your home or unsecured mailboxes. Retrieve and review your mail promptly. Thieves may use the personal information contained in your mail to steal your identity.
9. If you do not receive your regular bills when expected, call the company to find out why.
10. Review your monthly account statements thoroughly. Investigate suspicious items immediately to head off any possible fraud before it occurs.
11. Do not carry your Social Security card, passport or birth certificate unless needed that day.

You did NOT win a lottery where your bank account number is needed. You did NOT win a big prize that you have to pay a handling fee for. A rich relative you didn't even know you had, did NOT die and leave you his entire fortune if you just pay the legal fees. If it sounds too good to be true, it is. Report scams to the authorities.

Don't forget to recycle your newspapers and catalogs in the big green recycling bins located at Del City Elementary, Kerr Middle and Del City High School. Instead of creating more trash, create money for the schools.
