DelQuest Leadership Training

DelQuest is a youth leadership program sponsored by the Del City Chamber of Commerce, Rose State College, the City of Del City and local business leaders. The program was developed to stimulate the abilities and talents of tomorrow's leaders. It is a three day, two night supervised program that includes workshops, special leadership exercises, motivational speakers and community tours. This year's session will be Wednesday, November 12 through Friday, November 14. Chaperoned lodging will be provided Wednesday and Thursday nights.

FAQs

How do I apply for DelQuest?

The application will be online. You will need to print the reference letters. You may give to your school Guidance Office or mail to the Chamber of Commerce before September 22, 2014.

Who can apply?

High school juniors from Del City High School, Christian Heritage Academy, Destiny Christian School and local Homeschoolers located in the Del City area.

What are the benefits to the DelQuest participants?

DelQuest will prepare you to serve as a future community and business leader. It will expose you to leadership tools and introduce you to community needs, opportunities and resources.

What will it cost me?

Nothing. All program costs (meals, lodging, fees and materials) are funded with assistance from generous community organizations and businesses.

Will I be excused from class?

DelQuest participants will be excused from school with no attendance penalty.
